JESUS TOURED ALL OF GALILEE...

Two pairs of brothers ...

Fishing was their life and their livelihood ... James and John came from a line of fishermen ... they were working with their father when Jesus first called them ... and the immediately left everything behind and followed Jesus.

Who was this Jesus ... and why did his words command such clear and direct response???

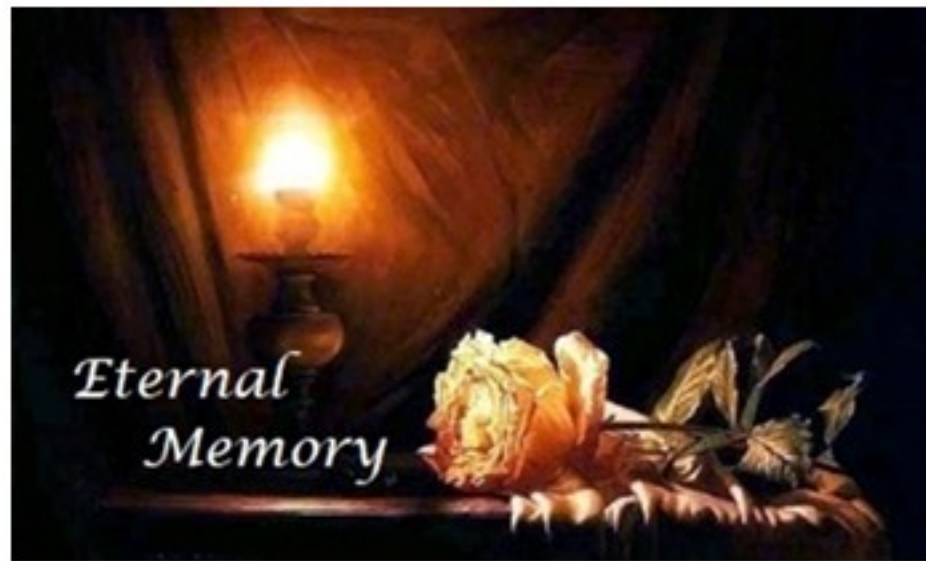
The Gospel goes on to say that Jesus then *toured all of Galilee* ... he went from town to village ... and in each place, he did the same ... he *taught* in their synagogues ... he *proclaimed* the good news of the kingdom ... and he *cured* the people of every disease and illness.

Here in the very beginning of the Gospel, we have a summary of the activity of Jesus ... and this forms an introduction into the Sermon on the Mount which will soon follow.

Teaching ... preaching ... healing ... form the heart of the ministry of Jesus. He taught in the synagogues ... where the people regularly gathered to read and reflect upon the Scriptures ... this was a natural place to find an audience.

But he did not limit himself to the four walls of the synagogue. He also went out into the lanes and countryside ... and there he found the crowds who perhaps did not participate in the synagogue services.

Finally, he healed their diseases. This does not mean that he healed everyone he met ... his task was not to eradicate disease. Rather, it was to show that even sin and illness did not have power over him. He comes to set us free.
