Gone Fishing!

How does that sound as a job description? Interested???

Well, that was pretty much the way Jesus called his first disciples. He told them to go fishing!



As he walked along the Sea of Galilee, he saw several fishermen. Fishing and farming were the two main industries of Galilee at that time ... and thus they form the background for many of the stories, parables and teachings of Jesus.

There must have been something very attractive ... very compelling about his call. People do not usually just drop their line of work ... leave family and livelihood behind ... to follow an obscure itinerant preacher. But this is exactly what the disciples did!

Religious teachings, at that time, were usually spread by wandering preachers ... they would travel the countryside from village to village ... and as they went, they would seek to spread their message.

Jesus told these fishermen to keep on fishing ... but this time, they would be fishing for people! And they thought it was tough trying to catch fish!!!
