**Father Vasyl Welcomed at Immaculate Conception Parish, Irwin**



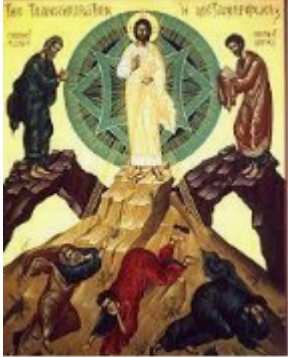
Last week Fr. Vasyl was invited to speak at Immaculate Conception’s monthly social “Theology on the Vine.”

Father gave a very informative talk on the history of the Greek Catholic/Byzantine Church in Ukraine. He continued with an update on the current aggression against Ukraine by Russia and concluded with a video of human experiences and how the churches in Ukraine are helping refugees.

Several parishioners from our parish were in attendance and were recognized and welcomed. In return the St. Stephen parishioners showed their appreciation by singing in Slovak , then English “God Grant Them Many Years”

In closing, Fr. Vasyl asked for prayers for Ukraine - as “*We are all children of our Heavenly Father*”

## TRANSFIGURATION OF OUR LORD



This biblical event appears in each of the Gospel books as an important moment in the life of Jesus and evidence of his divinity. After Jesus performs a series of miracles and foretells His own death, Jesus leads just three of his disciples, Peter, James and John, to a “high mountain.”

There He was transfigured before them. His clothes became dazzling white, whiter than anyone in the world could bleach them. And there appeared before them Elijah and Moses, who were talking with Jesus. Peter said to Jesus, “Rabbi, it is good for us to be here. Let us put up three shelters - one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.” (he did not know what to say, they were so frightened.) then a cloud appeared and covered them, and a voice came from the cloud: “This is my Son, whom I love. Listen to him!” Suddenly, when they looked around, they no longer saw anyone with them except Jesus. As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus gave them orders not to tell anyone what they had seen until the Son of Man had risen from the dead. Mark 9:2-9
